

GLOBAL STUDIES – MAJOR REQUIREMENTS FOR POLITICAL SCIENCE

Students majoring in Global Studies will complete the requirements for the **Global Studies major and another B.A. or B.S. major** to obtain a single degree with two majors. Global Studies majors take **6 credits in core courses**, **12 credits in a language and 12** elective credits for a total of **27 credits**. With approval, students double-count up to **12 credits** taken for general education or the joint major.¹ No course may fulfill two categories of General Requirements. (If you use any course for both Major and Gen. Ed., be sure to count the credits only ONCE toward the degree total.) To graduate with a degree in GS, a student must achieve a grade of **C** (**2.0**) or better in all courses required for the major and **6 credits must be at the 300-level or above**.
